And we shared stories of his time in Tanzania, where I and my wife had visited in April 2016. And we share these African trips with our 6th grade teacher Jackie Williams who was also at Jones Harrison when Jay first took up residence there. She truly enjoyed our visits, along with three other classmates. Our 28th St and Ottawa "gang" (no real guns, just squirt guns) was good hearted, fun, friendly and well bonded. There was always someone or many to get together with... Barry, Myron, Jon Garon, Gary Feldman, Mark Goldsteen, Greg Gepner, Michael Levy and the Sklader twins, Linda and Lette. Whether it was bicycle tag, go cart riding with R.D. (Robert Darryl Gosh), sliding at Klocheck's, being "actors" in Harley's early cinematography career, playing with plastic toy army soldiers in the excavation made to build your family room addition, or playing tag in houses or buildings under construction (until the police chased us out), we always found plenty to keep us busy, exploring and discovering without the distractions of today's world of electronics.
